Description:

It is a requirement of the Health & Safety law that employers should provide a safe and healthy environment for their employees.

If the assessment of First Aid needs highlights the need for qualified First Aider's, then this Level 3 qualification (Level 6 in Scotland) will provide you with suitable, highly trained personnel.

This comprehensive three-day course covers a wide range of First Aid emergencies, enabling all participants to deal with an emergency situation with confidence in a prompt, safe and effective way. This course will give the participants a qualification to the highest level.

Duration:

A minimum of 20 hours spread over at least three days.

Ideally, the course should be run over three consecutive days, but we have the flexibility to accommodate your specific needs if you so desire providing it is completed within 10 weeks of starting the course.

Syllabus

A range of subjects is covered including:

- Legalities, responsibilities and reporting
- Dealing with an unresponsive casualty
- Fractures and spinal injuries
- Control of bleeding
- Poisoning
- Burns
- Epilepsy
- Stroke
- Crush Injuries
- Lyme's Disease
- Assessment of the situation
- Shock (All types)
- Heart attacks
- Head injuries
- Chest injuries
- Asthma
- Wounds and bleeding
- Fractures
- Hypothermia/Exposure
- Incident management in remote locations: including evacuation planning
- Resuscitation
- Bandaging
- Choking
- Eye injuries
- Sprains and strains
- Diabetes
- Catastrophic chainsaw injuries
- Spinal injury management
- Suspension Injuries

Certification:

Assessment is ongoing by the instructor along with a question paper on each day.

A three year Level 3 Award in First Aid at Work (Level 6 in Scotland) will be issued to the learner, subject to successful assessment. No external assessors are required.

Numbers

A maximum of 12 students can be accommodated on this course and all learners must be a minimum of 16 years of age.
